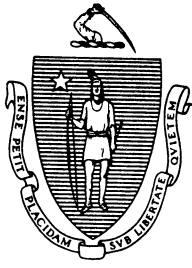

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY- SEVEN

AN ACT RELATIVE TO ADMINISTRATIVE FINES IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

WHEREAS, the deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Board of License Commissioners in Cambridge may assess a fine not to exceed three hundred dollars against a person where said board following an evidentiary hearing finds that said person has violated a licensing statute, ordinance, or regulation enforced by said board and related to hackney carriages; jitneys; livery services; enterprises transmitting requests for transportation to operators of hackney carriages, jitneys, or livery services; or to enterprises which may have liens on licenses for hackney carriages, jitneys, or livery services. No fine may be assessed unless the respondent has been given seven days' written notice of a hearing, either in person, at the respondent's last known place of abode, or at the respondent's usual place of business. Nor may any fine be assessed unless the board finds that a violation of a licensing law, enforced by said board, has been proved by a preponderance of the evidence.

Any such fine levied pursuant to the provisions of this statute shall be regarded as civil, administrative, and judicially reviewable pursuant to section

four of chapter two hundred forty nine of the general laws.

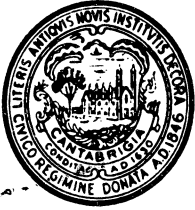
