WHEREAS: John was the chairman of Gravestar, Inc., the founder of Greenworks, an environmentalist activist, a developer, a former political candidate, involved with the youth of the city, and was the director of the Cambridge Irish Famine Memorial Committee; and

WHEREAS: As a recent college graduate John began his career as an advocate for change by working in the neighborhoods of Worcester, fighting against arson and pollution and starting the grassroots Massachusetts Fare Share program; and

WHEREAS: In 1983, John founded the National Toxics Campaign, which was instrumental in getting the \$8 billion Superfund federal environmental cleanup law passed; and

WHEREAS: John was a philanthropist who supported many local and national Charities assisted individuals and, fought against deregulation of the electric industry in Massachusetts and founded the Health Action Alliance, which is working to bring universal health care to the Bay State; and

WHEREAS: John grew up in Stratford, Connecticut and became involved in environmental issues when an asbestos manufacturer in Stratford built a little league field over a toxic dump that allegedly caused the death of a friend from cancer; and

WHEREAS: John was a graduate of Clark University; and

WHEREAS: John was the author of two books on environmental issues, "Getting the Lead Out" and "Who Owns the Sun;" and

WHEREAS: John's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Carolyn G. Mugar; his daughter Chloe; his parents Katherine and George F. O'Connor Jr.; his sister Emily Karolyi; his brothers Jeff and James A. O'Connor; his brother-in-law Sandor Karolyi; his sisters-in-law Amy and Daria O'Connor; his nieces Mary and Kaitlin O'Connor, Jennifer Flaherty, and Lexy, Kati, and Emily Karolyi; his nephews Jimmy O'Connor, Peter Flaherty, and Peter and John Mugar; and his many godchildren; and

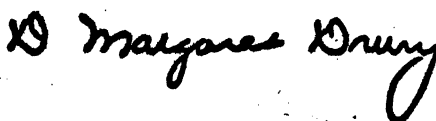

John O'Connor, developer, environmental advocate, 46

John O'Connor, an environmental activist, developer, and former candidate for Congress, died yesterday in Cambridge Hospital after apparently suffering a heart attack while playing basketball in the Cambridge YMCA. He was 46.

The chairman of Gravestarr Inc., Mr. O'Connor was the founder of Greenworks, a company that helps "incubate" environmental start-up companies.

"John was a great man, and the world is a better place because of his compassion, great love, and unyielding drive to help other people," said his wife, Carolyn Mugar O'Connor.

Described as a tough competitor but warm and generous with a zeal for life, Mr. O'Connor had a motto he kept over his desk: "The fun is in the fight."

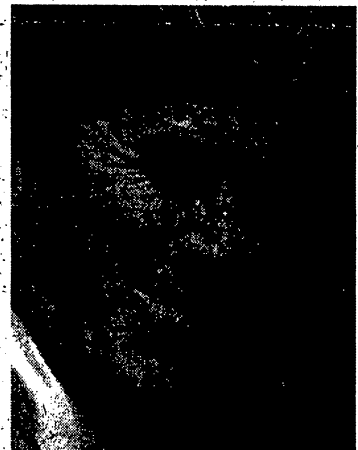
That summarized his philosophy, say those who knew him.

Jim Braude, a former Cambridge city councilor and manager of his campaign for Massachusetts' 8th Congressional District, said Mr. O'Connor's legacy of activism and environmental consciousness will benefit others for decades to come.

"Every single person John worked with — from the president of Ireland to the kids he helped on the streets and in the schools back home — knew that his passion was to leave the world a better place than he found it," Braude said. "In that he clearly succeeded."

In 1998, during a speech kicking off his run for Congress, Mr. O'Connor told the audience that growing up in Stratford, Conn., sparked his environmental consciousness.

The city is home to Raybestos, one of the largest asbestos manufacturers in the nation, a key em-

ployer in town and the sponsor of his Little League team, the Raybestos Cardinals. But during his sophomore year at Clark University in Worcester, Mr. O'Connor learned that Raybestos had built the team's baseball diamond atop a dump it once used for toxic chemicals, which some suspected in the cancer death of a teammate.

After graduating from Clark University, Mr. O'Connor joined Volunteers In Service to America, a government-funded organization dedicated to ending rural and urban poverty; he helped organize a low-income Worcester neighborhood.

During the next three decades, Mr. O'Connor's activism continued: He helped organize labor unions in the 1970s, founded the National Toxics Campaign in 1983, a grass-roots movement which lobbied for passage of the Superfund Cleanup Law, and fought against deregulation of Bay State utilities in the 1990s.

Mr. O'Connor acquired a net worth estimated as high as \$25 million when he married Carolyn Mugar, heir to the Star Market fortune. But he used the money to further what some described as urban populist activism.

In 1991, he founded Greenworks to give financial backing to fledgling environmental businesses. And Gravestarr funded a \$13 million, environmentally friendly overhaul of Porter Square.

A trustee of Clark University, Mr. O'Connor also was a director of the Irish Famine Memorial Committee. He also authored two books on the environment, "Getting the Lead Out" and "Who Owns the Sun?", and was working on a book on food policy.

In addition to his wife, he leaves a stepdaughter, Chloe of Cambridge; two brothers, Jeff of San Diego and James of Saugus; a sister, Emily, of Washington, D.C.; and his parents, Kay and George O'Connor of Stratford.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete.

Dr. Samuel Stewart, chief of medicine

Dr. Samuel Stewart, former chief of medicine at Jordan Hospital in Plymouth, died Nov. 16 in a car accident in Naples, Fla., where he spent winters for the past 13 years. He was 81 and a resident of Plymouth.

Dr. Stewart was born in Brockton. He graduated from Harvard College and Tufts University Medical School.

He served in the Army Air Corps.

A cardiologist and internal medicine specialist, he began his practice in Plymouth in 1952. He was chief of medicine at Jordan Hospital for 30 years. Upon his retirement in 1986, the cardiology department was named in his honor.

At the time of his death, Dr. Stewart was president of Newfield House in Plymouth, where he was medical director from 1962 to 1986.

Dr. Stewart served on the Plymouth School Committee for 12 years beginning in 1958. He was a member of the board of directors of the Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra and chairman of the board of directors of Plymouth Plantation in 1998 and 1999.

He enjoyed sailing and cruised the coasts of Maine, Massachusetts, and the Caribbean.

He leaves his wife, Marilyn (Crowell); two sons, Samuel K. Jr. of Holden and Geoffrey of Plymouth; two daughters, Suzanne Stewart of Rutledge, Pa., and Marsha Stewart of Watertown; his twin brother, Goodwill M. of Duxbury; and five grandchildren.

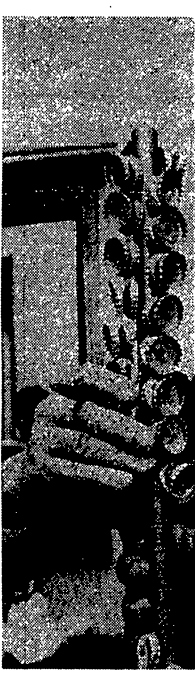

Budd Boetticher; directed Westerns

Budd Boetticher, a maverick Hollywood director whose Westerns starring Randolph Scott in the 1950s are considered classics of the genre, died Thursday at his home in Ramona, Calif. He was 85.

Mr. Boetticher, a onetime professional matador whose fascination with bull fighting served as his entree to filmmaking in the '40s, is considered by many film historians to be one of the five or six finest directors of Westerns, a reputation based on six of the seven modestly budgeted films he made with Scott between 1956 and 1960: "Seven Men From Now," "The Tall T," "Decision at Sundown," "Buchanan Rides Alone," "Ride Lonesome," and "Comanche Station."

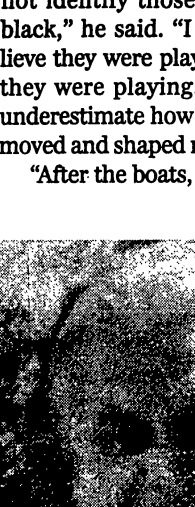
