- WHEREAS: Municipal regionalism must consist not merely in quantitative cost-cutting measures undertaken by neighboring communities, but in cooperation among neighboring communities which confront common qualitative concerns; and
- WHEREAS: In our Metropolitan area we have a concentration of college and university students whose total number is second only to the student population of Tokyo. As such, Cambridge, Boston, Medford, Newton, Somerville and Waltham are confronted with a common concern which is fertile ground for regional sharing and response. Running the gamut from impact on the daily life of neighborhoods, to provision of university housing, both present and projected, at the undergraduate, graduate and faculty levels, to contemplated plans for expansion, it is essential that consultation rather than notification be the linchpin in college and community dialogue which can usher in an era where representatives of both will speak with rather than at each other; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That, under the sponsorship of the Cambridge City Council, a Regional Committee for City and College Communication be established and that His Honor, the Mayor, appoint two members of this Council thereto; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager forward a duly prepared copy of this Order to the Honorable Mayors of the Cities of Boston, Medford, Newton, Somerville and Waltham, together with an invitation that each appoint two members from their respective City Councils to this Committee so that the first meeting thereof can be scheduled during the early days of the upcoming academic year. The City Manager is requested to provide the names of the forementioned appointees to the Cambridge City Council appointees as quickly as possible.
