WHEREAS: In that this effort was organized by the City-Wide Youth Employment Office and supported by the Professor Charles Ogletree and Harvard Law School; and

WHEREAS: Through the efforts of Cambridge business people, Harvard Law students, the Chamber of Commerce, youth employment program representatives, and some city officials the effort generated more than sixty jobs in one afternoon towards the goal of three hundred private sector jobs for the summer; and

WHEREAS: Summer employment for young people is one of the most positive statements that our community can make; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record in congratulating all those who participated in this event, and in particular to thank Professor Charles Ogletree of Harvard Law School, Saphira Baker of the City-Wide Youth Employment Office, Gerald Oldach of the Chamber of Commerce, Jim Keegan of Cambridgeport Bank for helping to make this event a success; and be it further
