WHEREAS: Homelessness among the people of this city is of great concern to this City Council; and

WHEREAS: The Hildebrand Family Self-Help Center of St. Paul AME Church is a non-sectarian, non-profit organization dedicated to helping homeless families re-establish stable productive lives in the community; and

WHEREAS: The Center manages two Family Lodging Houses which provide shelter and supportive services for up to 14 homeless families; and

WHEREAS: St. Paul AME Church has donated three parcels of vacant land on Pine Street, valued at over \$170,000, has raised over \$210,00 in donations, grants, commitments, donated materials, labor, and professional services toward a total development cost of \$580,000, for the development of St. Paul Homes, six units of affordable housing for homeless families in Area IV; and

WHEREAS: St. Paul Homes was prepared to break ground for construction in spring of 1990, but the withdrawal, due to State budget cuts, of previously committed 707 rental subsidies forced St. Paul Homes to rework its budget and seek additional grant revenues; and

WHEREAS: Now, St. Paul AME is requesting from the City of Cambridge the final \$100,000 needed to build St. Paul Homes; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council request the City Manager to grant The Saint Paul AME Church \$100,000 needed to build St. Paul Homes.
