Keystone Long Distance, Inc., a Virginia corporation, has applied to the Department of Public Utilities for authority to provide resold telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Keystone Long Distance, Inc. proposes to offer long distance, travel and 800 services to business and residential customers.

This investigation is officially captioned:

Application of Keystone Long Distance, Inc., under the provisions of Chapter 159 of the General Laws, as amended, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a resale, value-added or interexchange common carrier within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Comments, objections and requests for a public hearing on the proposed service must be made in writing with specific reasons for requesting a public hearing, and filed with the Secretary of the Department on or before May 16, 1994.

The petitioner, Keystone Long Distance, Inc., is required to complete the following: (1) Give notice by publication hereof once, on or before April 25, 1994 [which is twenty-one (21) days prior to May 16, 1994], in the Boston Globe, the Morning Union (Springfield), the Berkshire Eagle (Pittsfield), and the Worcester Telegram; (2) Give notice by mailing a copy hereof on or before April 25, 1994 to the Local Exchange and Other Common Carriers on the attached Interexchange Carriers list; and (3) Make return of service and publication no later than May 23, 1994.
