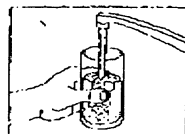

The Environmental Educator awards honor individuals in each state who have demonstrated exceptional work in drinking water education.

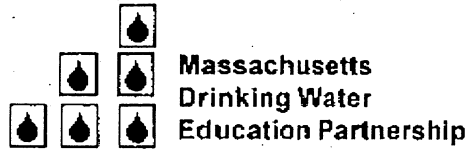
DEP Source Protection Awards
