Members of Gaelic School of Cambridge ask you again to look up this matter about the Grant that the Board of Aldermen and Council of 1907 gave. They Granted use of Maize Hall in City Building Breittle Square. This Hall is vacant on Thursdays and very seldom used on any other day of the month it used to be the Armory. So since then it is used once on a while by Grand Army &c for Banquets. They have the particular times listed on a regulation card hung up there. and they transact their business in some of the three or four stalls down stairs. Still they insist that we would be violating their rights if they let us in and insist on ignoring the Permit of your Honorable Bodies. How in the name of common sense are we interfering with their rights? It seems to us a case of the Wolf and the Lamb. Ho dare you disturb the water which I am drinking the poor Lamb all trembling replied how can that be when the water runs from you to me. No matter six months ago you vilily slandered me; ~~how~~ How could that be? "I am not yet six months old." No matter it was some of your relations" So he devoured the unfortunate Lamb. Where is that Equality that Lincoln refered to at Gettysburg in his Memorial Speech 1863 when he said Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this Continent a new Nation conceived in liberty and Dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal &c. Again we would refer you to the Sermon on the Mount Forgive us as we forgive those that trespass against us. Love thy neighbour as thyself. and still as you would that others should do to you, do you also to them we are afraid it is like the case in the scripture wherein the man was forgiven much and when he met the one that owed him and cast him into prison &c. &c. 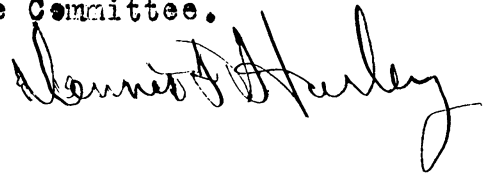
ON PUBLIC PROPERTY
