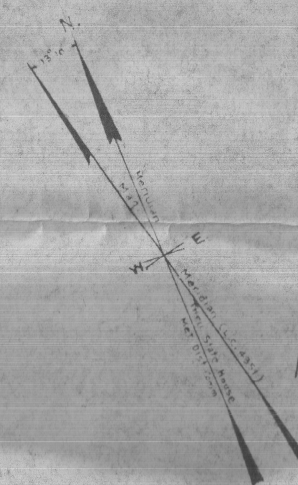
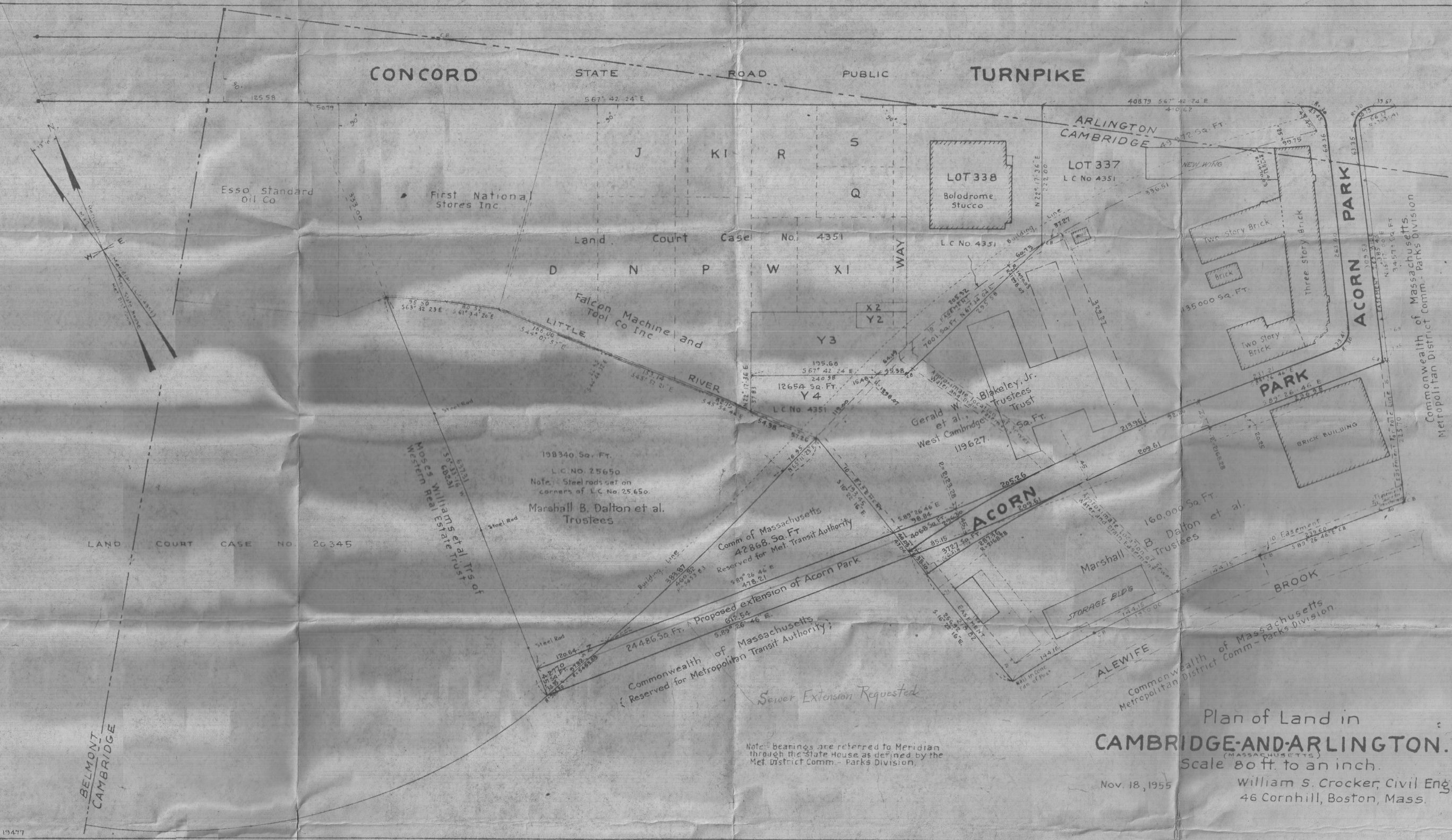

Dear Mr. Curry:

Enclosed is a formal petition to the City Council which I am told must be submitted before work can proceed on installing sewers in the extended Acorn Park Street. Although appropriate plans have been previously submitted and really no details of information are lacking to the City engineers, I have attached a plan to the formal petition in order to simplify examination and understanding by the City Council.

Sincere our building is scheduled for completion in December, it is very desirable that the utilities be available some time before that to permit appropriate connection of the building to water, sewage and utilities. It would be appreciated if this petition can therefore receive the attention of the Council at the earliest feasible date.

Other legal documents relating to relocation of some other sewers have been in the hands of Mr. Roger Tyler of Rachemann, Sawyer & Brewster, 53 State Street, Boston for some time and are promised within a day or two. They do not relate to the petition to the Council but do have a bearing on some of the work which the City will do in relocating sewers. It is my understanding that this latter sewer will also serve the Bowldrome and Quickie Car Wash for the removal of waste water. You may have heard reference to this matter which is why I mention it, although it has no bearing on the petition to the City Council. We are doing everything possible to expedite completion of the required papers for the City Engineers.




