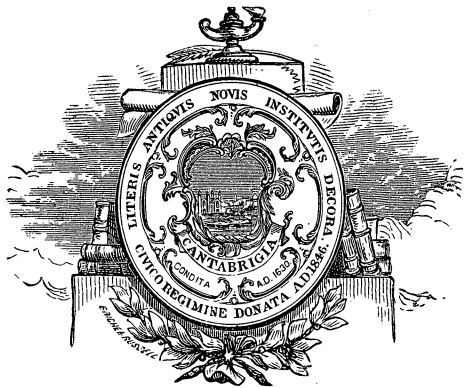




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

Nov 12. 1889

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that a certain private way extending from Kirkland Street, westerly to the line of Everett Street, extended and produced, and designated as Irving Street,

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *fifty feet* in width between *Kirkland Street* and the line of *Everett Street* extended and produced, - and to be called and known as *Irving Street*, -

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *W.A. Mason* for Surveyor, dated Oct. 20. 1889,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street, and the grade thereof is hereby established in accordance with the profile shown upon said plan.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, the several owners of abutting estates having waived the usual notice and agreed in writing to make no claim for such damages.
