Whereas: A careful analysis of this situation will be useful in planning strategy to attract appropriately-sized food stores to neighborhoods in need of them. Therefore be it

Ordered: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Community Development Department, with the help of an outside consultant if necessary, to prepare a comprehensive survey of all food stores in Cambridge. Such survey will establish several categories to cover types of stores, including but not limited to: general service stores selling staples, specialty stores like green grocers, fishmongers, delicatessens or other stores selling prepared foods, convenience stores with limited inventories and long hours of operation. Such survey will also include size of the stores surveyed, an evaluation of available parking, both off-street and curbside, an evaluation of public transit access and the frequency thereof, and an analysis of the population density in the residential areas within walking distance of the store. Businesses located in close proximity to Cambridge just over city borders in abutting cities and towns shall also be included in said survey. Furthermore, such survey will make an assessment of the prices of several selected staple items available at these stores; and be it further

Ordered: That the City Manager then direct the Community Department to make an assessment, based on the results of such survey, of which neighborhoods in Cambridge, based on population density, most sorely lack access access to food stores. Such report shall include graphics in the form of mapping of such observations and shall be available for comment at an advertised and televised public meeting no later than December 15, 1994.
