- WHEREAS: Mary always showed care and sensitivity to her job and her patients as was demonstrated when she knew there was a need for the accumulation of blood for surgery to be performed, she began the very first Blood Bank at the hospital, something which is still in existence today; and
- WHEREAS: Mary will be truly missed by her colleagues and friends and associates of the hospital for her unselfish dedication to her work; and
- WHEREAS: Mary's friends will honor her at a testimonial to be held on Wednesday, June 11, 1980 at the Stephen James House; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation to Mary Fay, R.N. for her thirty-five years of continued and faithful service to the Cambridge Hospital, and to wish her well on her years ahead; and be it further
