WHEREAS: A recent meeting of the City Council Sub-Committee on Elder Affairs was held concerning the building of a comprehensive Senior Citizen Center; and

WHEREAS: Several options were discussed at this meeting which included sites in the area of Porter Square and along Mass. Avenue; and

WHEREAS: The City Manager indicated that in these days of severe fiscal constraints, that if the city owned the land, that the construction cost would be reduced considerably; and

WHEREAS: The Center is in the very early stages of planning, but no options should be excluded from consideration; and

WHEREAS: There is a site adjacent to the present center in North Cambridge which might be a possibility for expansion, as long as much needed parking is included for the residents of 2050 Massachusetts Avenue and their visitors, and health care providers; and

WHEREAS: This particular site, is presently being considered for an alternative use; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Director of Community Development before any decision is made regarding the disposition of this property, so that all options will remain open for the development of the Senior Center.
