To the Honorable, the City Council,
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully ~~prays~~ represents that, in obedience to an Order of the Mayor and Aldermen in the year 1870, his fence was moved in front of his estate on Prospect Street, at an expense of \$55.35, and 63 square feet of land were thereby taken from his estate.

The fence so removed was placed precisely in the position of a former old fence, as he is able to show to your honorable bodies, so that the land thus taken from his estate had been enclosed as a part thereof for considerably more than forty years, and he had acquired a good title to the same.
