- WHEREAS: Edna is a life long Cantabridgian having graduated from local public schools as well as from Saint Elizabeth's School of Nursing, Simmons College where she received a Certificate in Public Health and from Columbia University where she received her Master's Degree; and
- WHEREAS: Edna first went to work for the City of Cambridge in 1943 as a Staff Nurse for Public Health working in that capacity until 1947 when she became Director of Public Health Nursing while also working in the Navy Reserve Corp from 1944 to 1946; and
- WHEREAS: Edna by virtue of her dedication and experience has become the symbol of "public health nursing" and will be greatly missed by her friends and colleagues; now therefore be it
