WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has recently experienced a tremendous growth in the area of Irish oriented business, cultural activities, and influence; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has much in common with the country of Ireland; a shared love of peace, a passion for the arts, a respect for diversity of cultures, and the ability to bring national concerns to the local level and local concerns to the national level; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the Mayor be directed to appoint a blue ribbon committee on behalf of the City of Cambridge, a committee to be known as the Cambridge-Ireland Sister City Committee with the view in mind of establishing a sister city relationship with an appropriate city or town in the country of Ireland during the 1996-1997 City Council term; and be it further

ORDERED: That the Cambridge-Ireland Sister City Committee include but not be limited to elect officials, members of the Cambridge business and academic communities, and interested members of the public; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the City of Cambridge Sister City Coordinator to provide any assistance as requested by the Cambridge-Ireland Sister City Committee in order to achieve this sought after sister city relationship.
