- WHEREAS: Small property owners wanting to make minor changes in their houses or property sometimes get caught up in long waits at the Board of Zoning Appeal; and
- WHEREAS: These type of cases usually are routine when they are finally heard; and
- WHEREAS: It is the intent of the City Council to make City Government work efficiently for residents as long as no one's rights are abrogated or abused; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager recommend to the City Council a procedure whereby minor property changes, such as curb cuts or front yard parking could be by an administrative procedure of the Board of Zoning Appeal when such approval is required but that that procedure continue to require notification of abutters and also require a hearing if objections to the changes are filed.
