- WHEREAS: Massachusetts has 665,000 people, one-third of them children who have no health care insurance; and
- WHEREAS: Massachusetts' uninsured residents are mostly the working poor and their dependents, parents with disabled children, low-income elderly and parents on Aid For Dependent Children (AFDC), who can't get jobs without giving up their health care benefits; and
- WHEREAS: A recent state-wide poll showed that 89% of the people in Massachusetts feel that access to health care is a basic right to which everyone is entitled; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record supporting the concept of "health care for all" and to urge the Massachusetts Legislature to adopt the legislative proposals currently under consideration.
