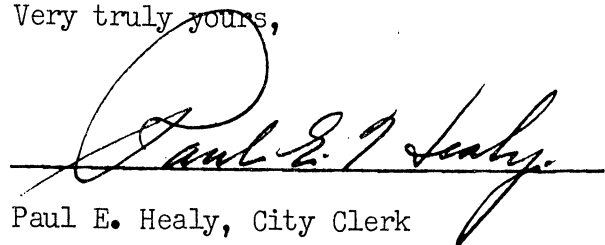

IN CITY COUNCIL
December 7, 1981

WHEREAS:

In the November 3, 1981 municipal election, Cambridge voters voted 17,480 to 5,973, about three to one, to urge this City Council to "call upon our representative in Congress to oppose sending U.S. troops, military advisors, arms, or military aid of any kind whatsoever" to the government of El Salvador, among others; and

WHEREAS:

The voters of this city are joined in this position by several organizations and churches, most recently including the Roman Catholic Bishops of the United States; and

WHEREAS:

When the foreign military assistance bill comes before the United States House of Representatives, perhaps as early as this Wednesday, December 9, an amendment is expected to be offered removing military aid to El Salvador; therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council call upon the House of Representatives, and particularly our own Congressman, Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr., to support the amendment removing military aid to the present government of El Salvador; and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Clerk transmit a certified copy of this resolution to Speaker O'Neill as soon as possible.
