In order that the smoking/no-smoking ordinance be maximally effective it is ordered that

A committee be set up immediately by the City Manager to

1. consider clean air standards by which to enforce the Ordinance;
2. evaluate and present requirements for non-smoking areas;
3. determine whether it is possible to maintain high clean air standards through the use of "smoke-eaters" or other technological methods as an alternative to assigning non-smoking seating.

The Committee, appointed by the City Manager, should include a representative of inspectional services, citizens, appropriate professionals, and representatives of the various groups interested in this ordinance and should reports its findings to the City Council by June 1.


