WHEREAS: Robert joined the faculty of the Rindge Technical School in 1938, after he graduated from Harvard College; and

WHEREAS: Robert was named headmaster of the Rindge Technical School in 1961; he was the fifth in succession after the school's founding in 1888 by Frederick Hastings Rindge; and

WHEREAS: Robert served as headmaster with dedication and distinction until his retirement in 1977, which coincided with the merger of the old schools; and

WHEREAS: After his retirement, Robert began a second career as headmaster of the Manter Hall School in Harvard Square, from which he has recently retired for the second time in his educational career; and

WHEREAS: At the age of ninety, Robert remains one of Rindge's most steadfast and enthusiastic supporters; and

WHEREAS: Robert was named "Headmaster Emeritus" by the Cambridge School Committee; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending congratulations to **Robert R. Sweeney** on being named "Man of the Year" by the Rindge Alumni Association; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to **Robert R. Sweeney** on behalf of the entire City Council.

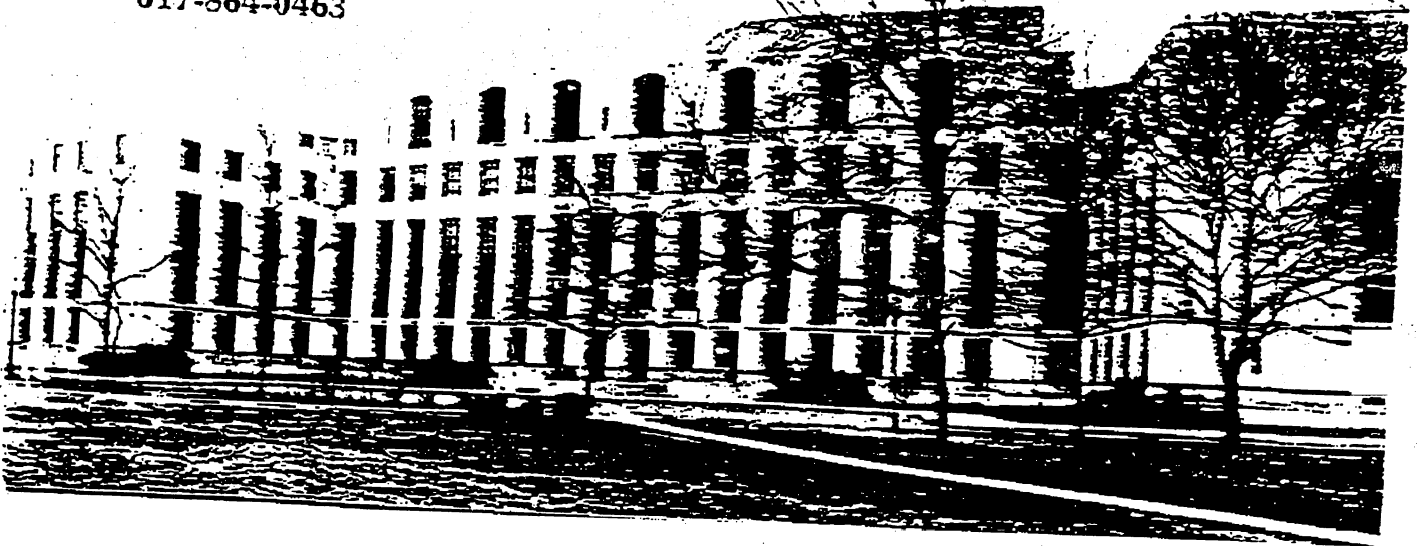

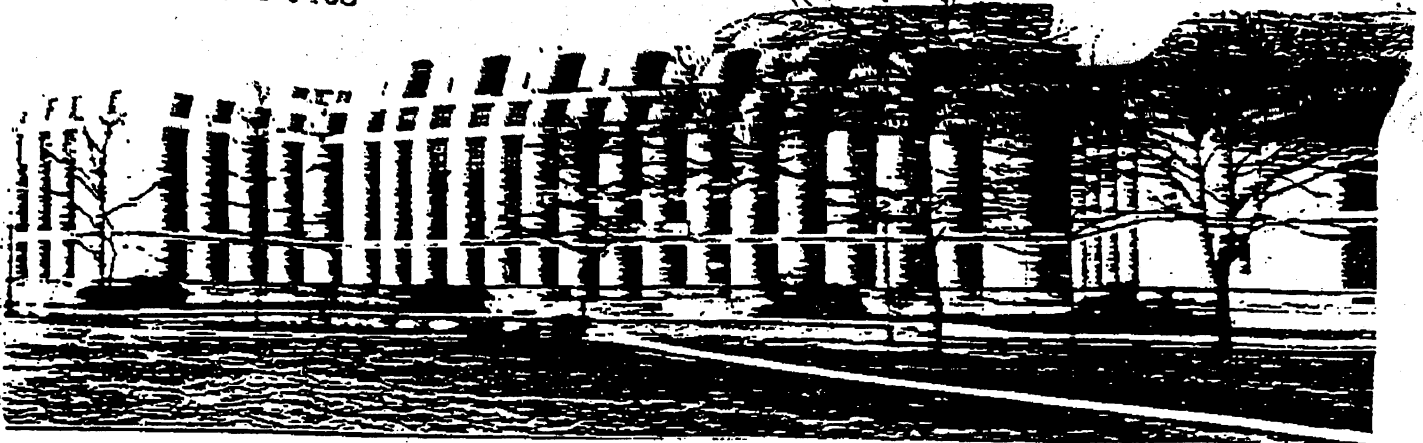

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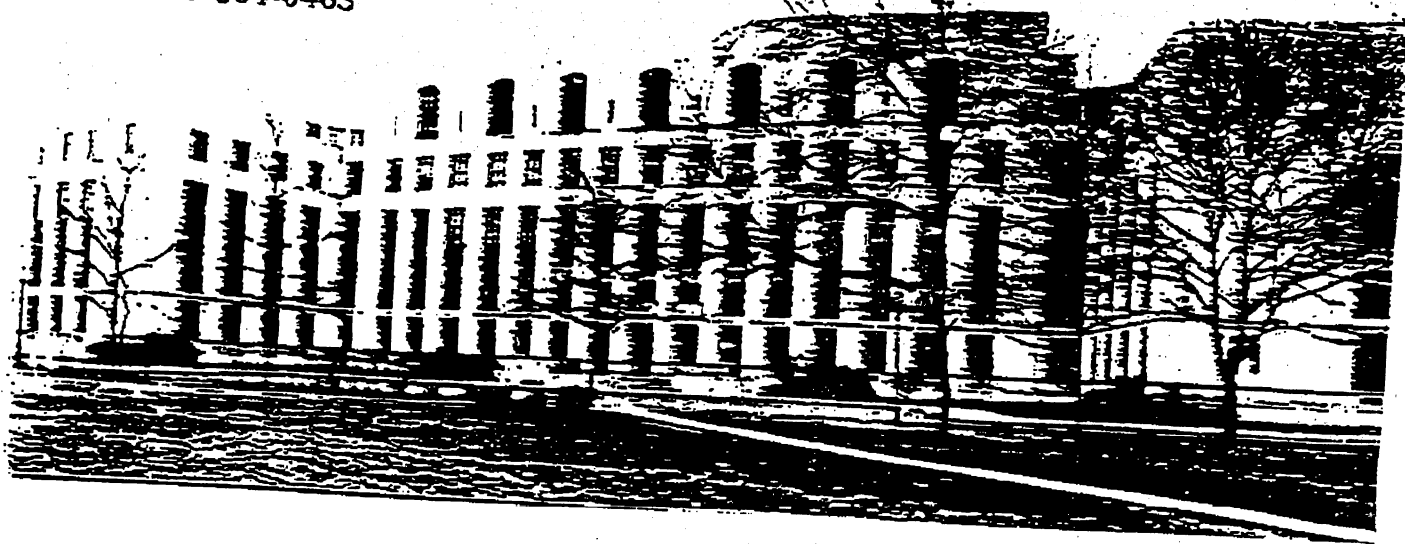

Robert R. Sweeney, Headmaster



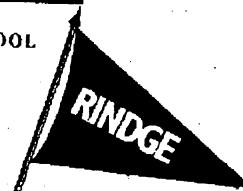
Robert Sweeney was named headmaster of the Rindge Technical School in 1961—the fifth in succession after the school's founding in 1888 by Frederick Hastings Rindge. Bob is extremely proud of his long association with Rindge which dates from the 1938 when he joined the faculty after having graduated from Harvard College. He remarked once that Rindge was an exceptional school, one which had "the uncanny success in attracting excellent teachers." Bob retired in 1977, coinciding with the merger of the old schools, and began a second career as headmaster of the Manter Hall School in Harvard Square. Recently retired for the second time, Bob turned ninety years old and remains one of Rindge's most avid supporters. The Cambridge School Committee named him "Headmaster Emeritus." He has been close to the Rindge Alumni Association for decades and will be named its "Man of the Year" next month. It is with great pride that the Cambridge Alumni Association inducts Robert R. Sweeney into its Hall of Fame.
