As requested and required, we at Catch A Rising Star, the legendary comedy and music club in Harvard Square, petition the City Council for permission to maintain an A-frame "sandwich board" to be maintained outside of our location at 30B JFK Street.

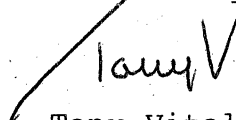
The sign would be attached to the sign pole at the curb outside of our building from 10 AM until Midnight, seven days a week. The sign itself is 20" wide by 49" high with a depth of about 8-9" at the base when extended.

If approved, we would have the sign painted with our logo at the top followed by an arrow beneath it pointed toward our doorway. Beneath that would be a simple sentence describing what we do. Although we haven't yet defined exactly what those words would be, it would be something along the lines of "great comedy and music seven days a week."
