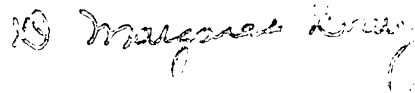


RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Heywood family on behalf of the entire City Council.

WHEREAS: Stephen was a graduate of Colgate University; and

WHEREAS: Stephen was an outspoken advocate and crusader in the fight against amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) and whose personal battle with this disease was chronicled in the documentary film "So Much So Fast"; and

WHEREAS: Stephen, along with his brother James Allen Heywood, was co-founder of the ALS Therapy Development Foundation which was founded in 1998; and

WHEREAS: Stephen's struggle with ALS was the subject of feature stories in The New Yorker, The New York Times, and The Wall Street Journal and appeared on the television newsmagazine "60 Minutes;" and

WHEREAS: Stephen's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his devoted wife Wendy (Stacy) Heywood; his son Alexander Stephen Heywood; his parents John and Peggy Heywood; his siblings James and Ben Heywood; his sister-in-law Sherie Heywood; his nieces Zoe and Elliot Isabel Heywood; his aunts and uncles; and his cousins; and

WHEREAS: Stephen will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it
