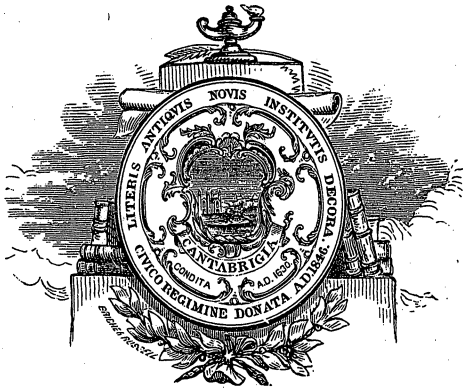


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen, December 14th 1870

WHEREAS, by an order approved the *fourteenth day of December 1870*
certain parcels of land, therein described, were taken on *Elmwood Avenue*
~~street~~, and the same were laid out as a public street or way of said city, it is therefore

Ordered, That due notice be given to

James Russell Lowell
Heirs of Lowell Estate

and all other persons interested as owners, proprietors, tenants, occupants, or otherwise, in said land, that they cut off, pull down, remove, and carry away all buildings, erections, and obstructions of every sort standing on and projecting over the lines of said *Elmwood Avenue*
~~street~~, as established by the ^{order} ~~resolve~~ aforesaid, or move and set back the same to the said line, and vacate and surrender the land and premises taken as aforesaid, on or before the *nineteenth day of December* now next ensuing.

And in default thereof, the Committee on Roads and Bridges are hereby directed and empowered forthwith to enter upon said land, and cause all buildings, erections, and obstructions standing on and projecting over the lines of said *Elmwood Avenue* ~~street~~, as established by the ^{order} ~~resolve~~ aforesaid, to be cut off, pulled down, removed, and carried away, or sold in such manner as they shall deem expedient, or to be moved and set back to said line, and the said land to be vacated and surrendered under the direction of said Committee.
