Joseph F. McCarthy Sr. of Framingham, a retired Watertown firefighter, died Wednesday at his home. He was 83.

Born in Newton, Mr. McCarthy graduated from Our Lady's High School and lived in Watertown for 50 years before moving to Framingham.
