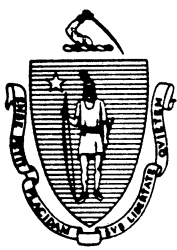

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Department of Public Utilities proposes to amend its regulations (220 CMR 99.00 et. seq.) which implement the Dig Safe Law, G.L. c. 82, section 40. The purpose of the amendment is (1) to define key terms used in the enforcement of the Dig Safe Law; (2) to set out the procedures which must be followed during emergency excavations; (3) to establish uniform methods to identify the location of excavation cites; (4) to set forth the standards for determining penalties for violations of the statute and regulations; and (4) to make other minor amendments to the regulations.

The Department will hold a public hearing on Friday, August 18, 1989, at 10:30 A.M at the Department's offices, 100 Cambridge Street, 12th floor, Boston, Massachusetts on the proposed regulations pursuant to G.L. c. 30A, sec. 2, to determine whether the Department should adopt these regulations.

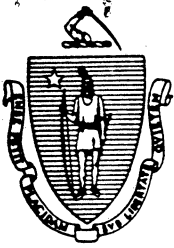
Interested persons may present facts, opinions or arguments relating to the proposal at the public hearing.

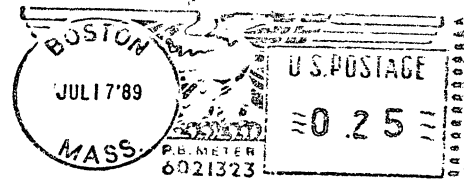
