WHEREAS: City funded outreach workers are available to aid individuals in processing food stamp applications in English and foreign languages; and

WHEREAS: Food pantries are scattered throughout the city at churches, neighborhood houses, cultural centers, apartment dwellings and many other facilities, providing easy access for all persons in need of their services; and

WHEREAS: On November 16th - November 20th, The Bread & Justice Campaign, a School Food Drive, will be seeking donations of non-perishable canned and packaged foods and desperately needed financial contributions; now therefore be it
