This City Council learned of the impending resignation of School Superintendent Alflorencia Cheatham as a result of the demands of the Board of Directors of the Cambridge Civic Association that he meet with that group to discuss personnel appointments in the School System, and

WHEREAS:

Mr. Cheatham has stated, in his resignation letter, that he has no intention of explaining or acting in concert with any political group relative to his stewardship as Superintendent, and

WHEREAS:

This City Council admires the firm stand taken by the Superintendent who is answerable only to the elected members of the School Committee in the conduct of his office, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record congratulating Mr. Cheatham for the strength and independence which he demonstrated against a vociferous minority group who have decreed that they know best what is best for the City of Cambridge despite the fact that they do not represent the majority of the electorate in our city, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record endorsing the administration of Superintendent Alflorencia Cheatham with the fervent hope that he will continue to remain at this post and rebuff the pressures of the self appointed guardians of the public school system, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That Mr. Cheatham be congratulated for refusing to resign as reported in the public press today.
