Dear Councilor Davis,

On October 26-28, 2001 the Cambridge Arts Council (CAC) will convene a national conference on the *Conservation and Maintenance of Contemporary Public Art*. The conference, which is funded through a grant from the National Endowment for the arts and co-sponsored by the Cambridge Center for Adult Education and the Harvard University Art Museums, is the first national conference on this subject. Artists, arts administrators, conservators and curators from sixty cities in twenty-two states, as well as from Canada, England and Australia will come together for three days to share first hand knowledge, experience and best practices in order to develop a comprehensive understanding of the complex issues involved in Public Art.

The Cambridge Arts Council's Public Art Conservation and Maintenance Program will be a featured topic of discussion at the conference. This high level of national attention provides CAC with an excellent opportunity to showcase the public art collection owned by the City of Cambridge and several prominent artists who have created works for the collection will participate to discuss their experiences. This type of national discussion also provides CAC with a unique opportunity to evaluate our procedures within a broad context and to further develop the conservation program in order to maintain the City's collection for posterity.

On Friday, October 26th from 7-9pm, CAC will host a special event at the new Walter J. Sullivan Water Purification Facility to showcase Cambridge's One-Percent for Art Program and dedicate the recently completed Mags Harries/Lajos Heder work *Drawn Water*. I have enclosed a conference welcome packet with a detailed schedule for your review.

I along with the rest of the CAC staff am thrilled that Cambridge will host this significant event and invite you to join us for a portion or all of this conference. If you do plan to attend I ask that you let me know so we can appropriately acknowledge your presence.
