- WHEREAS: A dedicated public school administrator and teacher, Ms. Margaret Carroll, has retired from her position as Principal of the Longfellow Elementary School effective June 30, 1989; and
- WHEREAS: Margaret, a native Cantabrigian, first entered the Cambridge Public School system as a third grade teacher at the Peabody Elementary School on November 5, 1951 serving in that position until September, 1977 when she was appointed as the Submaster of the school; and
- WHEEAS: Having demonstrated superior management and leadership qualities Ms. Carroll was appointed Master of the Longfellow Elementary School on September 1, 1977 where she immediately developed a series of curriculum changes and innovative programs which encouraged both the students and faculty to excell within the academic community which she oversaw; and
- WHEREAS: Margaret having received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Emmanuel College in 1948 and a Masters Degree in Education in 1960 from the State Teacher's College at Boston, has devoted her life to the educational development of the city's youngest residents; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere appreciation and gratitude to Ms. Margaret Carroll for thirty-eight years of total dedication to the children of Cambridge and to further extend to her every good wish for continued good health and happiness in the years ahead; and be it further
