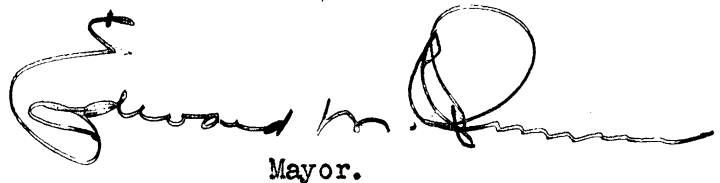
The Honorable, the City Council:

With feelings of sorrow I announce to you the death of Mr. John P. McCormack which occurred at his home in this city on Monday, January 21st.

At the time of his death, and for a period of more than twenty-eight years, Mr. McCormack had served as a member of the old Board of Registrars of Voters, and at the present time as Election Commissioner. In the years 1883 and 1884 he was a member of the old Common Council. During all of these years of public service he was always faithful to the trust imposed upon him.
