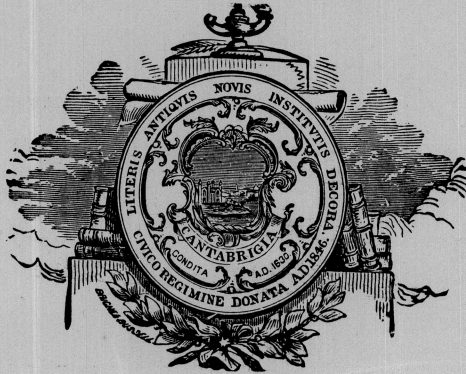


# CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN, *May 1.* 1894

Whereas, in the opinion of this Board, the public necessity and convenience require the removal of the trees hereinafter mentioned, to wit:

*3 Trees on Hammond Street, viz:*

- 1 at the westerly corner of Gorham Street,*
- 1 on the southerly side, opposite Howland Street,*
- 2 Trees at the westerly corner of Conner Street,*
- on the west side of Lowell Street in front of*
- vacant lot west south of premises of W. B. Durant.*

it is therefore hereby

ORDERED, That public notice be given, by advertisement in the newspaper called the *Cambridge Press* and by posting a notice upon said trees that this Board intends to remove the trees above mentioned and that *Tuesday* the *9<sup>th</sup>* day of *May* current, next, at *8 1/2* o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
