Please be advised that the Special Committee of the Council comprised of Councillors Alfred Vellucci, Alice Wolf and Walter Sullivan, along with Councillor Sandra Graham, inspected the Filter Plant of the Water Dept. between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 8th. The inspection consisted of a comprehensive review of the "filter treatment" process and equipment, conducted by John Cusack, Superintendent and Jon Beekman, Water Shed Manager. Discussion centered around the purification process, the equipment necessary, as well as the best way to protect our water resources from being contaminated.

The inspection of the Police Department was held on the same day between 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 Noon, centering on the jail cells for adults, male and female and the juvenile holding area. Also the Committee reviewed the booking room and motorcycle equipment. The inspection was led by Police Chief Anthony Paolillo and Lieutenant Timothy Toomey. Discussion centered around the feasibility of upgrading the cells in general, as well as the motor vehicle equipment.

Both City Manager Robert Healy and Deputy City Manager Richard Rossi accompanied the Committee on these inspections.
