WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is pained by the dire economic and social situation that plagues much of the African continent; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is particularly concerned about the possible impact this state of affairs will have on the next generation of African children; and

WHEREAS: In the memory of the June 16, 1990 uprising and massacre of the children of Soweto, South Africa, the council of Ministers of the Organization of African Unity (OAU) recommended that this be declared the Day of the African Child; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this FRIDAY, THE 16TH OF JUNE, shall be the DAY OF THE AFRICAN CHILD in the City of Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this City Council shall encourage the observation of this day in the City of Cambridge.
