That ^{it} is expedient that an iron bridge with stone piers and abutments, should be constructed across Charles River, between West Chester Park in the City of Boston, and Front Street extended, in the City of Cambridge, the same to be at the joint expense of said cities, - said expense to be divided equally between the two cities; and that this city is now ready to negotiate with the city of Boston for the building of said bridge, whenever said City of Boston shall signify its willingness to commence the work of such building
