- WHEREAS: Margaret C. Reardon was an employee of the City of Cambridge for a period of twenty-five years from October 1, 1943 until her retirement on October 31, 1968; and
- WHEREAS: Margaret C. Reardon, the mother of seven children, and the widow of John Bernard Reardon who was a member of the Lost Battalion of the American Expeditionary Air Force in World War I and died as a result of hazards undergone in the line of duty; and
- WHEREAS: Margaret C. Reardon served as a receptionist at the Out-Patient Clinic at the Cambridge Hospital and during that time won the admiration and respect of all who sought her help in times of emergency by her willingness to assist all who sought her aid by her calm manner which reassured patients and their families in times of crisis; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to make arrangements for the placement of a suitable plaque at the Out-Patient Department at the Cambridge Hospital in honor of this outstanding mother and civil servant who served the City of Cambridge so long and so well and whose career was an inspiration to all who knew her; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is directed to send a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family of Margaret C. Reardon to record the gratitude of this City Council for her outstanding contributions to the civic life of the City of Cambridge.
