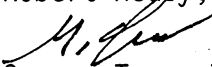

A meeting was held with Mr. Dobson, Project Developer of Forest City and he in turn met with a few residents concerning parking for residents in the area of Franklin St., & Green St. Areas.

As a result of this meeting along with a meeting with the Law Department concerning the parking requirements of the developer, it was decided that they could use their spaces for resident parking.

I have enclosed a copy of the letter that was sent to the area residents by Forest City Developers along with a plan showing the location of the available parking spaces.

Dear Neighbor:

We were recently advised of the growing concern over a shortage of available resident parking, and have consulted with appropriate City agencies as to how we might ease this problem.

Starting in October, Forest City will offer overnight and weekend parking at 38 and 64 Sidney Street, available exclusively to our resident neighbors within the boundaries shown.

There will be two sections of parking to allow for varied work hours and the early morning arrival of some of our tenants. Parking will begin at 5:30PM Monday through Friday and end at either 7AM or 8:30AM depending on the lot. No time restrictions will apply on Saturday or Sunday. The attached map indicates the hours which apply to each lot.

As future buildings are built, we may find it necessary to shift the overnight parking to other locations. By doing so we hope to be able to offer this service indefinitely.

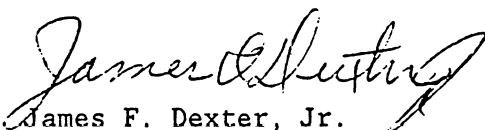
The fee will be \$25 per car per month -- necessary to offset costs for management of this operation and the security officer who will patrol at night. We will hold this price through 1992 and then review it on an annual basis.

To assure that this service is limited to residents within the area shown, we will require proof of residency within the area.

Parking passes will be sold the last four business days of the month in the Forest City Management office located at 26 Landsdowne Street in Suite 100. Sales will take place from 7AM to 9AM on the first two days and 5PM to 6PM the last two days. Sales will be by check only made out to Forest City Commercial Management.

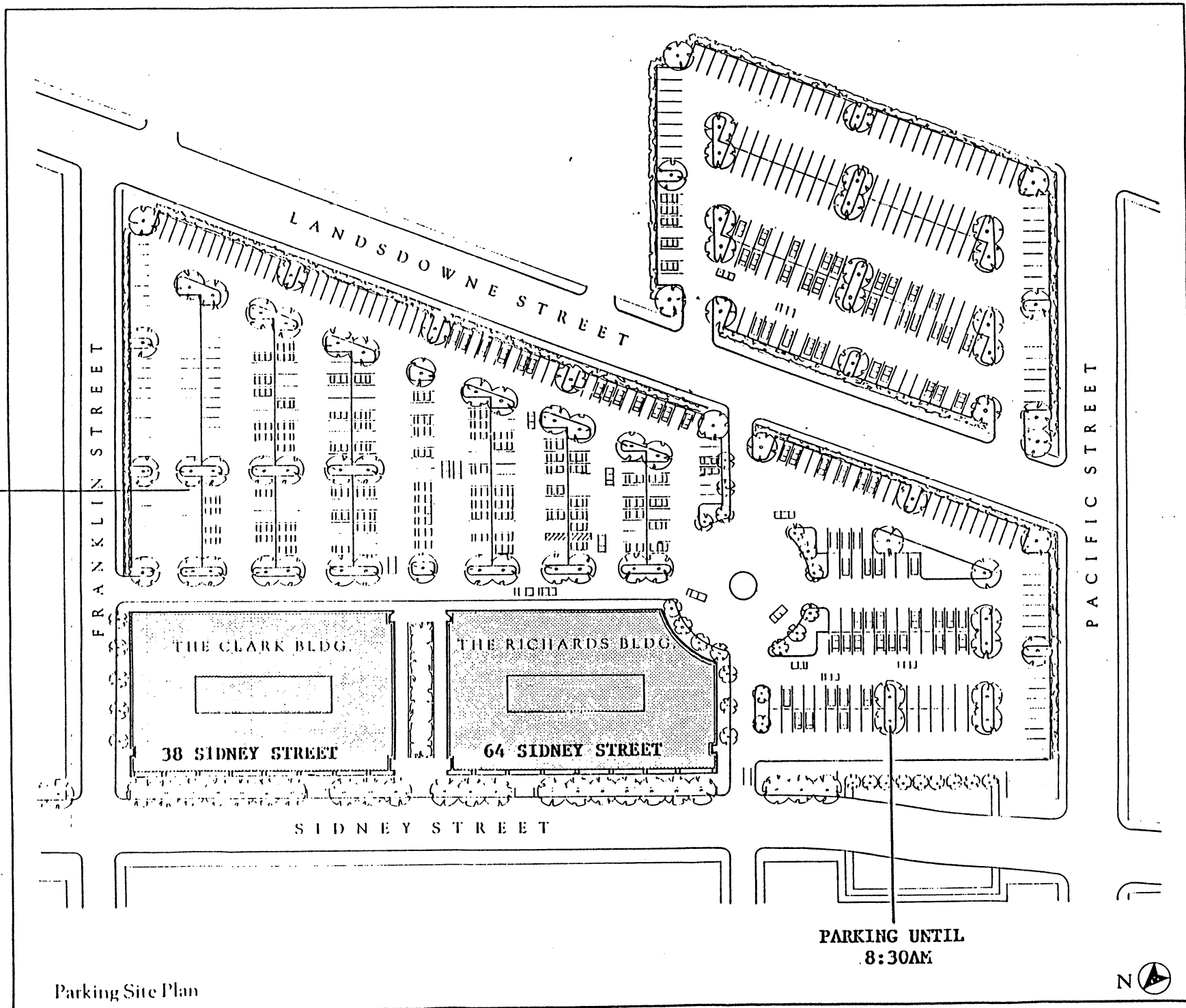
