Peoples Telephone Company, Inc., a New York corporation, has applied to the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") for authority to provide pay telephone services, including 0 + calls within Massachusetts. Specifically, Peoples Telephone has applied for approval of the transfer of the certificate of public convenience and necessity of FirstTel Phone Systems, Inc., previously issued by the Department in docket D.P.U. 90-256.

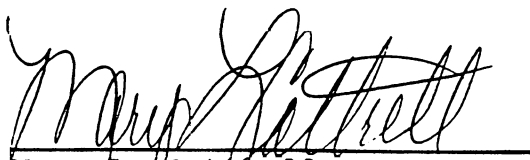

Application of Peoples Telephone Company, Inc., under the provisions of Chapter 159 of the General Laws, as amended, for a transfer of certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a resale, value-added, or interexchange common carrier within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts held by FirstTel Phone Systems, Inc., d/b/a FirstTel Communications.

Comments, objections and requests for a public hearing on the proposed service must be made in writing with specific reasons for requesting a public hearing, and filed with the Secretary of the Department on or before April 22, 1993.

The petitioner, Peoples Telephone Company, Inc., is required to give notice by publication hereof once, in the Boston Globe, the Morning Union (Springfield), the Berkshire Eagle (Pittsfield) and the Worcester Telegram, and to serve a copy hereof at least twenty-one (21) days prior to said date [April 30, 1993], on the attached list, and to make return of service and publication no later than May 3, 1993.
