WHEREAS: The project under discussion includes three grade separated pedestrian/bicycle crossings and a linear walkway/bikeway along the corridor from the cul-de-sac across from the Alewife Red Line Station to as near to Porter Square as possible; and

WHEREAS: Fifty thousand dollars from the City's Capital program to begin preliminary design in enough detail to finalize the actual location of the crossings, the length of the linear path, any right of way needs, and to prepare a more detailed cost estimate, has been allocated;

WHEREAS: Fiscal Year 95/97 State Transportation Improvement Program has allocated five million dollars in Federal Surface Transportation Safety Funds in FY 97 for the construction of these improvements; and

WHEREAS: Money is now needed to begin the design process so that the project can be advertised for construction by September 30, 1997; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record as being in favor of City Manager Robert Healy's request to the Metropolitan Area Planning Council for \$500,000 of the money earmarked for this project to be made available in FY 96 for the design of this project which is a high priority item and has the support of the entire community.
