Professional Experience

Jennifer Jones is a principal of Carol R. Johnson Associates, Inc. who joined the firm in 1981. From December 1992 to early 1994, she was the Managing Principal for preliminary landscape design of the \$8 billion Central Artery/Third Harbor Tunnel Project in Boston, MA. She directed the development of a plant pre-purchase contract program for procurement of high quality plants for the 28 surface restoration construction contracts for which an estimated 15,000 trees and 150,000 shrubs will be required between 1998 and 2005. She is also directing landscape design for the East Boston/I-90 contract area, including the entrance to Logan Airport, renovations to Memorial Stadium Park and creation of a new Bremen Street buffer park, and design efforts for site design of the new Massport Technical Center Garage and interface with the Harborwalk park along the Boston harbor at the airport.

Ms. Jones has been involved with many campus landscape projects at Carol R. Johnson Associates, including projects at Harvard University, Harvard University Business School, Radcliffe College, Hobart and William Smith Colleges, Hanover College, and Williams College. She has directed six of the firm's projects at Duke University, through the Facilities Design and Construction Office. Among them are:

Working with the project architects, she is currently overseeing development of a site plan for The Cambridge Hospital in Cambridge, MA, for which a new ambulatory wing, parking garage and site improvements have been mandated.

Ms. Jones is directing final design for a Women's Garden at the Pine Street Inn in Boston, where a new 100-bed shelter for homeless women opened in August 1992. She has developed site plans for Glenmeadow, a new continuing care facility in Long Meadow, MA; she has also developed site designs for the new residential Hospice of Cambridge and has provided landscape consultation for the Needham, MA, Hospice.

Working as a volunteer with the Friends of Neville Manor, Ms. Jones is preparing a master plan for landscape maintenance and capital improvements to Neville Manor, the City's nursing home, which is located on an extraordinarily heavily wooded site overlooking the Fresh Pond Reservoir.

She has also managed such notable projects as:

- John F. Kennedy Memorial Park (on the Charles River in Cambridge, MA)
- Boston Museum of Science (entry plaza and landscape improvements)

She has been instrumental in drafting site maintenance manuals and guidelines for several projects, notably for the Digital Equipment corporation and the John F. Kennedy Park.

She has been a guest lecturer/jury member at several schools of landscape architecture, including North Carolina State, Harvard Graduate School of Design, and the University of Massachusetts; she has also lectured on landscape architecture in China, on the large-scale use of wildflowers, on rooftop garden design and other topics.

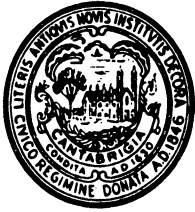
