Under date of April 22. 1861.
"The following Resolve and Order
were adopted and sent down for
concurrence: -

Resolved, That the public
convenience and necessity require
that Remington Street, from
Main Street to Harvard Street,
should be laid out as a public
highway.

Ordered, That Remington Street,
from Main Street to Harvard Street,
be accepted and laid out as a
public highway, forty feet in width,
as delineated on a plan drawn
by W. A. Mason and W. S. Barbour,
Surveyors, dated July 10, 1850, now
on file in the office of the City
Clerk, which Plan is hereby

adopted by this Board."

Under date of April 24, 1861.
"The following Papers came up, the
Common Council having concurred
in the previous action of this Board,
viz. — — Order accepting and
laying out Remington Street." — —
