- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Frank Marckini, a native Cantabrigian and late employee of the Department of Traffic and Parking; and
- WHEREAS: Frank attended local schools and upon graduation, served his country well during World War II as a member of the United States Army and upon being honorably discharged, worked for several years at the Continental Can Company; and
- WHEREAS: Frank entered the employ of the City in 1979, working as an employee of the Cambridge Housing Authority as Director of the Jefferson Park Youth Center, where he directed various field trips, recreational and physical activities in the North Cambridge area; and
- WHEREAS: Frank transferred to the Department of Traffic and Parking in 1983, where he held a job of various responsibilities prior to his untimely death; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Orease Marckini and the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Marckini on behalf of the entire City Council.
