WHEREAS: The City Council has again gotten complaints from Cambridge residents who are receiving fine notices from parking tickets that are as old as six years old and that were presumably taken care of; and

WHEREAS: Residents feel very unfairly treated when these old notices seem to appear from nowhere; and

WHEREAS: It seems that there should be some kind of a statute of limitations; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager request from the Director of Traffic and Parking a report of (1) why these ancient fines are appearing at this time; (2) how many such in-state fine requests are outstanding for over two years; and, (3) what current time limitations exist; and be it further

ORDERED: That no additional fine requests of over two years go out until the City Council have an opportunity to review the present policies.
