WHEREAS: This City Council has learned that Dr. Paul Goldmuntz is the recipient the 2004 Dr. Joseph H. Brenner award for his service as Clinical Director of Community Legal Services And Counseling Center's Mental Health Program; and

WHEREAS: Paul Goldmuntz has been at CLSACC since 1983, and has 24 years of experience as a mental health professional, with expertise in adult psychotherapy, affect theory, cross-cultural dilemmas, trauma, substance abuse, work related problems, couples' treatment, and personality disorders; and

WHEREAS: In a world where comprehensive, client-centered mental health services are increasingly being restricted by managed care, and drug treatment of symptoms without insight into cause, Dr. Goldmuntz's approach, at once inclusive, scientific and humane, promotes and preserves the promise of what mental health care can, and should, be. As Dr. Goldmuntz himself says, "our purpose is to operate a clinic that serves people and their needs;" and

WHEREAS: CLSACC's mental health program is unique both because its focus is on low income, uninsured clients, and it allows clinicians to treat clients in a supportive environment, for as long as it takes. Under Paul's direction, the program has successfully served over 8,000 people who wouldn't otherwise have been able to get access to the services they needed; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Goldmuntz has been and continues to be supremely effective in motivating and managing volunteer mental health professionals with over 250 clinical volunteers having contributed services at CLSACC over the past 20 years; now therefore be it
