In Board of Aldermen, May 10th 1871

Whereas: By a report made to this Board by the City Solicitor it appears that the land upon which the Old Toll House stands upon the southerly side of West-Boston Bridge, belongs to the Heirs of Josiah Mason, ^{senior}, and Whereas the said building has been allowed to remain there for the past-thirteen years, the City having collected rent for the same.

Ordered: That all claims of ownership that the City has in said building be and hereby are relinquished and given up to the said Heirs of Josiah Mason. The same to be in full for all claims that the said Heirs have or may have against the City for the use of said land.
