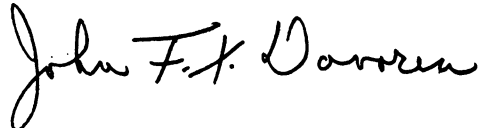

In accordance with the provisions of section five of said chapter 180 of the General Laws,
Tercentenary Edition, I request that you forward forthwith to this office a statement of the facts called for
by said section.

4. D. The Corporation shall not hold stock or other interest in any business enterprise which is an excess business holding under the provisions of Section 4943 of the Internal Revenue Code or its Regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended.

E. The Corporation shall not make any investment of any amount which jeopardizes the carrying out of its exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code or its Regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended.

F. The Corporation shall make no taxable expenditure as that term is used in Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code or its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. In accordance with the same, it shall not carry on any propaganda, or otherwise attempt, to influence legislation or the outcome of any specific public election or carry on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive, as those terms are used in Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code or its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. In particular, the Corporation shall not attempt to influence any legislation either through an attempt to affect the opinion of the general public or any segment thereof or through communication with members or employees of a legislative body or other government officials or employees who may participate in the formulation of the legislation. However, the Corporation may make available the results of non-partisan analysis, study or research and may provide technical advice and assistance to the extent the same are not taxable expenditures under Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code or its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. The Corporation will not make grants to individuals or organizations which are taxable expenditures under Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code or its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, nor shall it make any expenditure for any purpose other than one specified in Section 170 (c) (2) (B) of the Internal Revenue Code.

G. Notwithstanding any other provision of this certificate, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities which might give rise to taxation under the provisions of Sections 4941 through 4948 of the Internal Revenue Code and applicable Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. Notwithstanding any other provision of this certificate, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of such Code and Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. Upon

the dissolution of the Corporation or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the Corporation shall be distributed exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

1. Recognizing the high costs of college and graduate school education, and the restrictions such costs impose upon the standard of living of students during their academic matriculation, the corporation shall endeavor to enable members of the Boston University Community and others to purchase food, household and related supplies at the lowest possible cost by creating and exploiting a substantial purchasing power, thereby obtaining commodities from growers, manufacturers, wholesalers and others at below standard retail prices to be offered to members of the University community without profit to the Corporation.

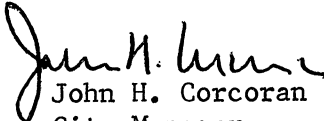
