The following petitions and papers, referred to the City Engineer, have received attention and the following reports are presented concerning them.

On the petition of Henry O. Marcy, with report of the Joint Standing Committee upon the same, relating to the line and grade of Main St. and the petition of John A. Little, relating to line of Western Avenue, no further action is necessary.

The order relating to grade of Allston St., between Brookline and Pearl Sts., has been complied with by revising said grade and the work has been performed as contemplated.

The petitions of C. B. Russ, Curtis Davis, and Geo. M. Rogers severally, for leave to maintain cellars below the grade fixed by Statute, have not received favorable consideration and no leave has been granted for the purpose.

The petition of the Second Baptist Society, relating to drainage under the Station House in Ward 3, and report of the Joint Standing Committee on Sewers and Drains, have received no further action for the reason that no personal ap-

Application has been made by the petitioners for executing said work.

The petition of the Union Railway Co., and order relating to a nuisance on land of Horace Saunders, require no further action.

Orders for the construction of cesspools passed May 1st, Sept. 25th, Oct. 9th, and Oct. 22^d, have been complied with.
