IN CITY COUNCIL

September 24, 1979

ORDERED: That a license be and hereby is granted to Paul Naughton of Boston Tours, Waltham, Massachusetts under the provisions of Chapter 159A, Section 7 of the Massachusetts General Laws to operate a common carrier as a sightseeing vehicle through the following streets in Cambridge:

From Memorial Drive along the Charles River (subject to the approval of the Metropolitan District Commission), taking a right turn on to Boylston Street through Harvard Square traveling along the area of the Cambridge Common and taking a left onto Brattle Street, at which point the tour bus will stop at the Henry Wadsworth Longfellow House. After a brief stop, tour bus will then travel down Brattle Street out to Route 2. Time of tour will take approximately one hour and ten minutes.

This permit is granted subject to the condition that NO pick ups will take place in the City of Cambridge.

This petition for a license is granted subject to the approval of the City Manager.

Provided further that the petitioner provide the City Clerk with a schedule of the vehicles to be used and a schedule of the departure and arrival times for the above described route.

Violation of any of the conditions outlined above will be the cause for revocation of this license.

Ladies and Gentlemen of the Council:

Thank you for having me tonight.

The Application before you tonight pertains to my future application to the Department of Public Utilities in Boston for a Permit of Public Need and Necessity. This Permit is required by law to operate sightseeing vehicles in the state of Massachusetts.

I must first obtain a local license from each of the ^{TEN}~~thirteen (13)~~ ¹⁰~~eleven (11)~~ cities and towns through which I pass. I have obtained approvals from ^{EIGHT} ~~eleven (11)~~ of these cities and towns. The City of Cambridge and the City of Somerville are pending. Four years ago, I was granted a local license from the Honorable City Council of Cambridge. Unfortunately, I was too young at that time to apply for the Department of Public Utilities permit.

Lastly, and most importantly, is the fact that the company I plan will serve hotels on Route 128. Tourists will never board my sightseeing van in the City of Cambridge. I will never hamper the cabs or any transportation company in Cambridge.

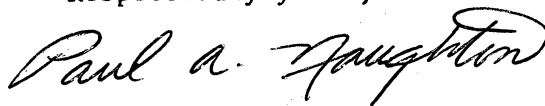

Dear Sir:

I am applying to the Department of Public Utilities, Office of Rail and Bus, for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, Mass. Laws, Chapter 159A, Section 7. It is a permit to operate a common carrier as a sightseeing vehicle.

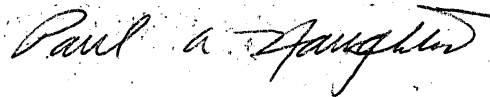
In order to do so, I must first obtain a local license to operate from each city and town through which I pass. This is stated in the Annotated Laws of Massachusetts, Chapter 159A, Section 1.

I am presently going through the process of obtaining local licenses from Boston, Burlington, Cambridge, Concord, Lexington, Medford, Newton, Somerville, Waltham and Woburn.

My tour business will be located in Waltham, based at Holiday Inn, Waltham, and will pick up customers from hotels along Route 128 (U.S. 95) between Woburn and Newton only. Our tours will be conducted in two 8-9 passenger vehicles, subject to inspection and approval by the Department of Public Utilities. We hope to start in the spring of 1980.
