Howard W. Fitzpatrick was the recipient of many honors during his lifetime having served as Sheriff of Middlesex County for more than twenty years, and having been named as the Outstanding Catholic Layman of the Archdiocese in 1952, and having been named a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre by Pope Pius XII for his philanthropy in the same year, and

Howard Fitzpatrick's prominence as a public and political figure was eclipsed only by his altruism in public and personal charities, and

The best testimonial to Howard Fitzpatrick was his life of good deeds and his generosity to charities of all faiths which earned him the accolade of a modern St. Vincent DePaul in the words of his good friend, Richard Cardinal Cushing, now therefore be it
