IN CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS: The new Cambridge revaluation will have a devastating impact on the elderly by forcing them to pay increased tax money which many of them do not have; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be respectfully requested to include in the next real estate tax bill mailing, a special letter or notice to the elderly advising them of their right to file an abatement petition, the right to have assistance from the City of Cambridge in filling out the abatement forms, and the right to a revaluation impact hearing as voted by Cambridge City Council months ago; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager also be requested to develop a financial plan whereby the elderly may be permitted to pay their taxes over an extended period of time without interest.
